DEMOCRATS 101 AND THE DEMOCRATIC CREED

On Friday, November 3, ACDP welcomed Bryan Watson to the Thunder Bay Winery to give a presentation on the principles set forth in an innovative book written by Jim Purvis "Democrats 101-A Primer for Us". Bryan is the MI liaison to the Democrats 101 organization. This great book discusses the need to change the partisan, toxic political discourse that has dominated this country over the past 8 years— an Us vs. Them mentality. Democrats need to establish an identity that defines principles that all, not just Dems, can universally believe in and communicate to others.

Republicans have established an "identity" with the emergence of Donald Trump, the "MAGA" identity, which gives the right-wing Republicans a sense of belonging to a "cause". Democrats 101 presents what is called the "Democratic Creed" of 6 principles, rooted in the Declaration of Independence, the U.S. Constitution, and protected by the Bill of Rights. These principles & beliefs are and should be what all Democrats undoubtedly believe and identify with. Frankly, these are principles every American, including Independents and even Republicans should identify with, as they are foundational American principles.

The Democrats 101 organization is undertaking a national movement to encourage Democratic County Parties to officially adopt the Democratic Creed as its guiding principles—it's identity. ACDP unanimously adopted the Creed at its October meeting with all 16 members present voting in favor. Seven Michigan Democratic County Parties have adopted to date, including our neighbors, Presque Isle and Cheboygan, with losco on the verge.

ACDP has created a "bookmark" with the principles of the Creed and will distribute them in our interactions with everyone. Visit Dems101.org. The website is replete with information and resources, and you can register on a link to receive its newsletter and order a copy of the must-read book. This is a grass-roots movement to move forward in a positive way.




Local, State and National News Updates

Line 5 Shutdown Myths vs. Facts

MYTH	FACT
Refineries in Ohio will be shut down if Line 5 is shut down	PBF Refinery in Toledo asserts that they have no other source of petroleum and would have to shut down without Line 5 and they'd lose 1,000 jobs. However, in investor filings, PBF indicates that they are mainly supplied by 3 pipelines- Capline and Mid- valley pipelines from the south, and Line 5 from the north. They also only employ 550 people so how they would lose 1,000 jobs is unclear.
This will leave the U.P. without much-needed propane.	U.P. residents will not lose access to propane. Line 5 only provides propane to roughly 12,000 homes and businesses in the UP and other propane sources and providers already exist. The U.P. Energy Task Force found several options other than Line 5 with comparable costs.
Propane prices will skyrocket	According to the most comprehensive study done to date, shutting down Line 5 might result in temporary price increases of not more than 5 cents/gallon- well within normal market price fluctuations.
There is no solution in place to protect U.P. residents who rely on Line 5 propane.	The state is already implementing the administrative recommendations outlined in the U.P. Energy Task Force propane supply report AND the energy market adjusts quickly. There are several solutions that could be quickly developed and deployed, including: Propane trucking from Superior, WI Rail transport from Conway, KS or Edmonton, AB Increased propane storage
There will be 2,100 trucks crossing the Mackinac Bridge every day and trucks are more susceptible to spills	This number reflects the full amount of product being moved through Line 5, not the much smaller amount that would be needed in Michigan. The amount of propane needed for Michigan would be roughly 3-4 truckloads per day or 1-2 train cars per day.
The Detroit airport will run out of jet fuel if Line 5 is shut down.	Based on numbers published by PBF, BP Husky and Marathon Refineries, Line 5 appears to supply only about 10% of the jet fuel at Detroit Metro Airport, not 40% as claimed by Ohio Gov. DeWine. Both Marathon and PBF have other crude oil sources, and other pipelines could provide feedstock to satisfy regional jet fuel needs. Alternatively, other nearby refineries in Illinois, Indiana and Ohio could make up this shortfall.
Thousands of Michiganders depend on Line 5 for their jobs.	Enbridge only employs 116 employees and provisioned contractors in Michigan. More jobs will be created by decommissioning and removing Line 5 (2,188 jobs) than by building a tunnel (1,763 jobs). More than 1.3 million jobs regionally depend on the Great Lakes, creating \$82 billion in annual wages.
