Protecting Americans' Freedom to Vote



The Senate is expected to push the Freedom to Vote Act in January 2022. Senate Republicans have refused to consider the bill, which has bipartisan support from constituents, choosing to deploy the filibuster instead.

In 2021, 52 restrictive voter laws were

passed in various states across the country, limiting options to vote and undermining local elections officials' ability to mind elections. In response to the influx in restrictive voting legislation, Congress introduced two voter rights bills: Freedom to Vote Act and John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act.

The John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act would make illegal voting rules that discriminate on the basis of race, language, or ethnicity and empower voters' to challenge discriminatory laws.

The Freedom to Vote Act (S. 2747) is currently in the Senate and would solidify comprehensive voter protections, including a minimum of 15 days for early voting, mail-in ballots, and making Election Day a national holiday.

The bill would set up national standards for voter identification. The bill would also establish protections for election officials against intimidation and partisan interference. To further ensure election integrity, the Freedom to Vote Act would require states to use voting systems with a verifiable paper trail and establish national standards for voter identification.

Local, State and National News Updates


Michigan officially has a set of new political district maps for House, Senate and Congressional races beginning in 2022.

Michigan currently has 14 US Congressional districts, although the state is losing a seat in Congress this year due to sluggish population growth since the last U.S. Census count in 2010. When the lines drawn following the 2010 census were first put into practice, Michigan's Congressional delegation was a 9-5 split in maps that heavily favored Republicans. In 2018, Democratic candidates flipped two of those seats, bringing the delegation to a 7-7 split. If voting patterns from the 2020 election hold, the new map would favor Democrats in 7 districts and Republicans in 6. Alpena County is in MI 01 District currently held by Jack Bergman-R. (Map Chestnut)

Michigan's state Senate maps currently heavily favor Republicans, although Democrats have made some gains in recent cycles. The current seat split is 22 -16 in Republicans' favor. The new map shows a neareven split and marks the best chance Senate Democrats have had in decades to capture a majority in the chamber. Alpena County is in Dist. 36 currently represented by Jim Stamos-R. (Map Linden)

The Michigan House has also been controlled by Republicans in recent years, with a seat split of 58-52 following the 2020 elections. A number of recent vacancies have shaved the current majority to 55, although Republicans still have the advantage. The Michigan House maps were among the most controversial during the commission's public comment period, with many commenters urging the commission to go back to the drawing board. Alpena County is in District 106 currently represented by Sue Allor-R. (Map Hickory)

The Office of Rural Development will be responsible for the following and more:

- Work with the MEDC and other stakeholders on rural economic development;
- Facilitate rural affordable housing development with the Michigan State Housing Development Authority;
- Promote sustainability, environmental preservation and green energy development;
- Address consequences of population and demographic trends in rural areas;
- Analyze and give guidance on education-related issues in rural communities;
- Collaborate with the Michigan High-Speed Internet Office to facilitate expansion of High-speed internet connections in rural communities;
- Coordinate with tribal leaders in the state on issues facing rural Michigan.
